That's why our teachers use routine activities such as diapering, feeding, and cleaning up as opportunities to talk to our babies about what we're doing and to interact with them in a gentle, nurturing way. At the same time, we listen, imitate, and respond to the sounds our babies make, respecting these as the beginning of communication.

Our *Infant Curriculum* provides numerous opportunities for infants to experience and explore their environment safely through simple activities involving language, gross motor, science and sensory experiences as well as fingerplays and songs. Babies who want to play will always find a willing adult for a game of Peek-A-Boo or Hide the Toy or Roll the Ball. In a quieter moment, there's a comforting lap to snuggle into for a story, a song or, maybe, just a gentle cuddle. And there are always familiar, loving arms to hold these little ones when they need security.
