

WOW. . . We Can't Wait to Explore!

Math: Our threes will be working on their one to one correspondence skills with counting eggs, creating our own patterns with feathers, looking at the cycle of a caterpillar to a butterfly, working on some Earth puzzles, sorting and counting cans, counting the legs on different pictures of bugs and using rocket puzzles, looking at the number of planets in the solar system and more!

Science: We will be looking at things that fly and that float, comparing leaves, using coffee filters to make butterflies, checking on the seeds that we planted and how much they are growing, "digging" in the sensory table, recycling objects, making "ants dance" with raisins, water, vinegar and baking soda, making alien slime and using sponges on our feet to walk like we are on the moon!

Literacy: The Zebras will explore pieces of string to create letters, thinking of words that rhyme with GO, playing I Spy and locating letters with a flashlight, discovering what maps can do for us, thinking of words that begin with the letter R, using pipe cleaners to make letters or a word, putting our thinking caps on to think about space and then drawing a picture to go along with our words and working on recognizing upper and lowercase letters.

Art: The art center is one of our favorites center...what will we be discovering this month? We can't wait to create our own binoculars, cutting out circles to make caterpillars, using chalk to make night time drawings, painting with feathers, creating recycled collages, making an Earth mural, using newspaper as a painting tool, using a body part to create "thumbprint bugs", creating ants in the sand, creating bee stripes with paper and scissors, painting moon rocks, making star prints and anything else we can squeeze in this monthl



The Best Nest By: P. D. Eastman


